Family Support Worker Update:

A polite reminder to all parents, it is your responsibility to let school know if for any reason your child is going to be absent. This should be done before 8am by phoning the school or sending an "in-app" message in Arbor. A lot of parents are not currently doing this and we are having to chase for a reason why a pupil is not in school.

Why do we need a call if your child is ill?

- It is our duty of care to know where students are if they are not in school during the school day
- We close the registers at 9.30am and perform our safeguarding role of checking all pupils are accounted for
- It helps Teachers to ensure things are in place for your child
- It helps Therapists to visit the pupils when they are in school

Why do we need to know by 8am?

- We can check pupil absences with those who have arrived in school
- We can locate missing pupils early
- If there is a genuine case of a pupil who goes missing, we can alert the police without any delay






End of Day Collection Times:

- visit your home and advise how you can reduce your energy use and costs.
- install suitable low-cost energy efficiency and water saving measures such as draught proofing for windows, LED bulbs, portable solar generators, aerating shower heads and more.



Eligibility

To qualify for a visit your home must meet all of the following criteria:

- you rent the property through a private rental agreement, or own and live in the property
- your household has an income of £30,000 or less (before tax), is in receipt
 of means tested benefits such as Universal Credit and Council Tax Support,
 or a member of your household is disabled
- the domestic property you live in has an energy performance certificate (EPC) rating of D, E, F or G, or does not legally require an EPC
